

What is the Jane Pauley Community Health Center?

The Jane Pauley Community Health Center serves the local community, regardless of insurance or income, with an emphasis on integrating medical and behavioral health along with access to various other social services. The center offers primary health care services, including preventive and annual exams, well-child care, acute care and certain procedures. The center also focuses on the management of chronic diseases, such as diabetes, cardiac disease and depression.

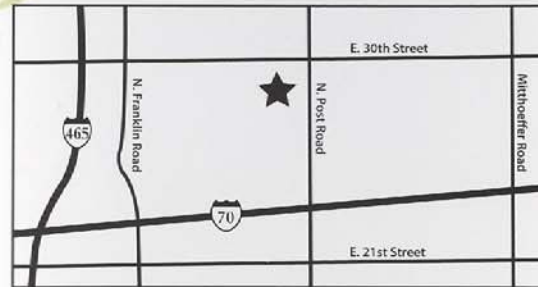


The Jane Pauley Community Health Center was established in 2009 with generous support from the Metropolitan School District of Warren Township, Community Health Network and the Community Health Network Foundation. It is named after Jane Pauley, a 1968 Warren Central High School graduate who grew up in the area and is well known as the former anchor of NBC-TV's "Today" and "Dateline" programs.

What kind of care does the Jane Pauley Community Health Center offer?

The center provides a wide range of primary health care services—including treatment of common illnesses and minor injuries—as well as behavioral care services.*

Here are just some examples of the services available (this is not a complete list):

Checkups and wellness screenings—Annual physicals, well-child checks, cholesterol and diabetes screenings, blood pressure, laboratory tests.

Vaccinations—Flu, pneumonia, hepatitis B, tetanus, childhood immunizations.

Treatment of common family illnesses—Colds, viruses, flu, ear infections, sore/strep throat, skin rashes, seasonal allergies, bladder infections, upper respiratory infections, sinus infections, insect bites, acne.

Chronic disease management—High blood pressure, diabetes, emphysema.

Behavioral care services—Screening for anxiety, depression, substance use and other chronic and acute issues; in-house treatment and referrals as necessary.

** For emergency care, you should call 911 or visit the nearest hospital emergency room.*



What kinds of patients does the center serve?

All are welcome at the Jane Pauley Community Health Center. It is located at a Warren Township school for the convenience of the community, but provides services to patients of all ages, not just schoolchildren and families. The medical staff provides primary care to meet your regular health care needs, especially when you have not had access to primary care providers in the past.

Who provides the care?

Patients at the Jane Pauley Community Health Center may be seen by a family physician, nurse practitioner, physician assistant, registered nurse, and/or a psychologist.



What does it cost?

The Jane Pauley Community Health Center's services are intended to be affordable and available to all, regardless of income or insurance coverage. Most major insurance, Medicaid and Medicare are accepted. Financial assistance programs are available for uninsured patients, based on income and family size.



Do I need an appointment?

The center strives to accommodate patients as quickly as possible when they need care. However, it is best to call for an appointment whenever possible, so that the staff may plan for your arrival and maximize your convenience.
